REOPEN PUBLIC MEETING

Open Public Meeting reconvened at 6:36 p.m.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Student Wolobah Covin was happy that Mr. Wayne Dennis is being appointed as Principal of P. J. Hill School.

Student Samantha Carnesi spoke in favor of Mr. Wayne Dennis and Ms. Rachel Halson and was grateful for all the advice and guidance they have given to her.

Student Antonio Wells thanked Mr. Dennis for being his mentor.

Mr. Wayne Chatham from B-MAC Productions had concerns about the transfer of staff among the four failing schools. He felt that the staff reassignments would be detrimental to the success of the schools.

Parent Wilma Woodward had concerns about the Child Study Team at P. J. Hill not addressing the needs of her child in a timely manner. She felt that information should be provided to parents to clarify test results and evaluations for their children. Ms. Woodward also felt that Principals should be given more support to discipline disruptive students.

Parent Waldemar Ronquillo thanked all involved in providing an adequate number of chairs for the MLK School graduation ceremonies. He also had concerns regarding Bilingual education. He stated that he has not received any communication from the District for parent participation in the formulation of the Bilingual plan due by the end of July. Mr. Ronquillo also had concerns regarding Special Education and the privatization of Transportation.

Dave Winogron, First Vice President of Trenton Education Association (TEA), felt that clarification should be given prior to Board action tonight, regarding the items that were pulled from the agenda. He also expressed concern regarding Finance Items N and R on tonight's agenda. He stated that services being requested in these Requests for Proposals correspond to job titles in the TEA Bargaining Unit Contract, and he said that no officers from TEA were consulted on this. He respectfully requested that these two items be pulled in the interest of transparency.

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Mr. Ethan Schlamm discussed the delay in paying out the Summer Savings checks, and he inquired why these checks are not being issued until July 15.

Mr. Emerson Simmons took issue with Finance Items EEE, FFF and III regarding Transportation. He stated that the original person hired by the State Monitor to input Transportation data was not able to perform the job, and the individual in Items EEE and FFF was brought in as a consultant to perform these tasks. Mr. Simmons said this consultant has been working for a month prior to being placed on the Board agenda, and he asked if the fingerprinting and background check are required for this consultant since he has been working with student personal data. He also said this consultant is performing duties previously done by an employee of the District, and he felt this would cause the District to incur a liability. Mr. Simmons asked that Items EEE and FFF be pulled from the agenda. He asked if it is legal for the State Monitor to hire a consultant who has not gone through the proper background check process. He felt that the State Monitor should be following State Laws.

BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS

Mr. Ward thanked the students who spoke on behalf of Mr. Dennis and Ms. Halson, and he stated this shows positive things happening in the schools. He addressed Ms. Woodward regarding her concerns about the Child Study teams. He stated there is a lot going on in this regard, and this will be discussed further at tonight's Board Meeting. Mr. Ward said this area is a deficiency in the District and is being addressed.

Mr. Ward spoke about the restructuring of the four failing schools and the concerns expressed by Mr. Chatham from B-MAC Productions. Mr. Ward said the District must follow State Law in this matter and does not have a choice. He empathized with Mr. Chatham's concerns.

Mr. Ward said he also wishes to know more about the Transportation system. He stated he was promised last year that a new computer system would be in place to help alleviate most of the problems, and he is seeking updates on this. He advised the public to register their children early to help avoid Transportation problems in September.

Mr. Shelton discussed the school restructuring, and he reminded Mr. Chatham that these were failing schools for five years or more. He said the District is forced to address this problem, and hopefully the changes will have a positive effect on student achievement.

Ms. Balmir congratulated all the graduating students, and she said there are many successes in the District. She praised the inspiring graduation speech of TCHS-West's valedictorian.

Rev. Sanders also congratulated the graduates, and he recognized Principal Hope Grant and all who assisted her with the ceremonies. He said the proceedings were efficient and elegant, and he was honored to attend. Rev. Sanders hoped more parents would come out

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early in the educational process to provide feedback and suggestions on increasing student achievement and the use of Federal funds. He said the graduation ceremonies were a strong indicator that the District is moving in the right direction, and he said this is due to the work of many stakeholders both past and present. Rev. Sanders said a pattern is emerging at the high schools in terms of preparation for higher education and for the workforce. He said a lot of hard work was put into this process, resulting in a marked increase in HSPA Literacy scores and a modest increase in HSPA Math scores.

Rev. Sanders also explained the process that is used by Administration to respond to parental complaints. He thanked Mr. Broach for his willingness to oversee the response process and his commitment to communicating with parents. He discussed some concerns raised by the public tonight, and he said the situations were the result of hard decisions that had to be made in light of limited funds. Rev. Sanders said the Board is trying to be transparent and communicative, and this will improve over time.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REMARKS

Mr. Broach thanked all Board Members for their comments, and he asked for a round of applause for all the District's graduates. He stated that there is much diversity in the graduating class, and he said their success was made possible through the involvement of parents, teachers and principals. Mr. Broach said the restructuring process is being undertaken with great care, reflection and purpose as directed by the State Department of Education. He said the restructuring is the right thing to do and the students deserve it.

Mr. Broach discussed the Administrators' Retreat that was held from June 28 through 30. He said topics addressed included how to be better leaders at all levels, and working together to best meet the needs of the students. Mr. Broach thanked everyone involved in the success of the students.

Ms. Balmir questioned the need for Finance Items K and L. Rev. Sanders responded that these resolutions were done prior to the Board deciding to meet during July. He said if there is not a quorum for a meeting in July other than the Retreat meeting, then Finance Items K and L can be utilized.

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Ms. Balmir asked about Finance Item II. Rev. Sanders said this RFP is needed because two of the major bargaining units are coming up for contract renewal, and the Board wishes to being the negotiation process very early. A concentrated discussion ensued regarding the services that New Jersey School Boards Association can provide in the negotiations process.

Ms. Balmir asked about Finance Item EEE and wished to know what services the individual has been providing. State Monitor Mark Cowell answered that the individual has been in District since June 6 fixing the software system in the Transportation department. Mr. Cowell said this software system was not set up correctly. He stated the consultant has also been working on a bid for summer school transportation. Ms. Balmir asked that Finance Item FFF be pulled so that the Board can ask Administration to investigate concerns that were brought to her attention. She said these concerns involve the reasons the consultant is working in the District. Rev. Sanders stated that Finance Item FFF would be **pulled**. Additionally, Finance Items N and R were **pulled**.

Mr. Shelton questioned Curriculum Item X and wanted more information on the process that will be used with Multiple Intelligences Theory. Mr. Broach explained that this Theory involves discussion of the different ways students learn, and this is what will be used in this project. Mr. Shelton had concerns about how the students will be perceived in the final report. Mr. Redd asked if the study will be supervised and conducted with appropriate University controls, and Mr. Broach answered that it will. Mr. Broach said he will be supervising this project, along with Special and Subject Supervisors.

Mr. Ward questioned Curriculum Item Z. He wished to know what services will be provided. Dr. Priscilla Dawson, Executive Director for Turnaround Schools and Funded Programs, stated that this will be funded by the School Improvement Grant (SIG). Dr. Heather Jackson, Executive Director for Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment, said there are a variety of programs that will be provided at TCHS-Main during the summer months. She said this requires the presence of the guidance counselors, who will be receiving training and working with Administration to ensure students are properly placed prior to September. Dr. Jackson said the guidance counselors are not 12-month employees, and they must come in during the summer to accomplish this work.

Rev. Sanders asked for a status on the District receiving the second year of the SIG Grant, and Dr. Dawson answered that we have applied for the Year Two funding but have not yet heard our status for the 2011-2012 school year for TCHS-Main. These are Federal monies that come through the State. A concentrated discussion ensued on the modifications to the SIG grant spending for Year One, and the effect of the State's response on proposed implementations at TCHS-Main during the summer.

Mr. Ward asked about Curriculum Item CC and what the cost will cover. Rev. Sanders answered that this item was previously approved by the Board, for four days of training, and the reason for placing it on tonight's agenda is to approve a date change only.

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Mr. Ward called the Board's attention to Special Ed Item EE. He stated the home instruction program has been the source of many problems in the past, and he asked if the monitoring of the program has improved enough that the District is comfortable with approving additional providers. Rev. Sanders discussed the Special Ed Committee's process of correcting past problems in home instruction and improving the program in the future. Mr. Ward expressed concern about past problems not reoccurring.

Mr. Shelton asked what the District has done to prepare for the influx of students from closed charter schools. Rev. Sanders said that it is not definite that Trenton Community Charter School will close, but the District has devised a plan to address this if it occurs.

Mr. Ward expressed concern that the District has not yet heard from the State Department of Education regarding resources for the summer and for the 2011-2012 school year.

At this time, Rev. Sanders wished to document the minutes as follows: many personnel decisions were made, and much hard work went into these decisions. He said that although the Board does not always see the operations of the District, they must trust that the Superintendent is making the best decisions possible. Rev. Sanders said a lot of trust is involved in turning the District around, and he is sure that decisions being made are going to be good for the District. He said that some of the changes are also going to be a mistake, and these must be worked out. He asked for trust that the people making decisions are doing so in good faith, and they will try to do the best they can. Rev. Sanders formally asked the Superintendent to prepare a report on the logic that was used to make the changes in Principals and Vice Principals. He said it is important that the Board is aware of the thinking behind personnel decisions that were made, and he asked the Superintendent to prepare a brief Executive Summary. Rev. Sanders said that personnel discussions may take place in Executive Session during the summer.

Rev. Sanders also asked Superintendent Broach to direct his staff, particularly Curriculum staff guiding professional development, to develop an evaluation tool to judge whether or not the professional development was effective. He observed that Principals will most likely be involved in assessing the impact of professional development. Rev. Sanders said the evaluation system should include whether learned teaching techniques are being applied in the classroom, whether these techniques are having any effect on Math scores and Reading scores, whether schools in trouble are benefiting and whether teachers at these schools are being offered professional development. Ms. Balmir also felt that a discussion on Special Education costs, issues and plans occur at the July Board Meeting. Rev. Sanders stated that Mr. Cowell and Ms. Pearl Charatz, Executive Director for Special Education and Student Services, have previously been asked to provide a report on this. Mr. Cowell said he would check with Ms. Charatz to see if this is possible prior to the Board Retreat on July 15. Rev. Sanders and Ms. Balmir felt strongly that this report be provided to the Board for the Retreat. A concentrated discussion ensued on the history of challenges facing Child Study Teams and Special Ed. Rev. Sanders said there are Child

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Study Team needs, and the issue of privatizing Child Study Teams should be part of the discussion now. Superintendent Broach asked Mr. Cowell to work together with Ms. Charatz on a summary for the Board before the Retreat.

Motioned by Mr. Shelton and seconded by Dr. Rosenbaum to approve the Consent Agenda. The Consent Agenda was **approved** by all Board Members present, with the following items **pulled**:
