New Jersey Sunshine Law - Read by Jayne Howard, Business Administrator/Board Secretary

The New Jersey Public Meetings Law was enacted to ensure the right to the public to have advanced notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interest is discussed or acted on.

On the rules of this act, the Trenton Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting by publicizing the date, time and place, therefore posted in the Central Services Building, 108 North Clinton Avenue, City Clerk's Office, City Hall and the Times. Anyone whose name is on the mailing list should receive a notice.

Formal action will take place at this meeting.

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Adoption Of Agenda

President Tatum asked for a motion to adopt the agenda. It was motioned by Ms. Johnson and seconded by Dr. Campbell to adopt the agenda.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

President Tatum read the following statement prior to public comment:

The Board President is the spokesperson for the Board of Education. It is not the role of the individual board members to respond to the public during Public Comment. This is the public's time. If the Board President feels that concerns need more clarification or background information for a factual response, it will be referred to the administration for a response.

Student John Gordon from TCHS-West spoke in support of Principal Torrance.

Ms. Ann Sciarrotta, Vice President of Trenton Educational Secretaries Association (TESA), expressed concern about the abolishment of three TESA positions in the Purchasing Department, and the creation of three Business & Technical positions in their place.

Ms. Patricia Vogt, President of TESA, read a letter from one of her unit's members expressing concern about the District's delay until December 2010 in making entitlement payouts for retiring and resigning employees.

Ms. Darcy Coligan, Art Teacher at Gregory School, spoke about the benefits of the art program in the District and hoped she is rehired for next school year.

PRESENTATIONS

Mr. Mark Cowell, State Monitor, updated the Board on his work in the District. He discussed several Special Education issues, including the extended school year for classified students, home instruction, attendance for out of district placements, and centralization and maintenance of Child Study Team files and records. Mr. Cowell provided the Board with suggestions for streamlining the Special Education department. He also advised that he and the Superintendent are working collaboratively on developing benchmarks for submission to the Department of Education. Mr. Shelton expressed concern about the existing Child Study issues that Mr. Cowell listed. Ms. Johnson asked about the procedure for out of district providers reporting student attendance to the District. Ms. Tatum asked about the impact of the loss of secretaries in the Child Study department. She also asked Mr. Cowell if he has looked at existing Board Policies to ascertain their relevance to the Special Education issues and concerns he has raised.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REMARKS

Dr. Lofton congratulated Ms. Betty Greene Blackwell, who received a Lifetime Achievement Award from the Mercer County Professional Counselors Association. He spoke more

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about the effects of staffing cuts in the Special Education department. He also discussed various cost-saving alternatives for out of district extended school year programs.

BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS

Mr. Shelton continued the discussion on Special Education and the possibility of keeping some students in district. The Superintendent stated the District was considering the possibility of placing some Special Ed students at Stokes School for an in district program. A concentrated discussion ensued on this issue and the problems in some out of district programs.

At this time, Ms. Tatum welcomed new Board Member Reverend Toby Sanders. Reverend Sanders stated he is honored to join the Board and looks forward to serving the community.

Mr. Shelton addressed student John Gordon’s concerns about the loss of the Principal at TCHS-West, and he explained the bumping process that must be followed by the bargaining unit. He agreed that the Principal has done a tremendous job improving the school. Dr. Lofton also praised Principal Torrance.
