CURRICULUM, INSTRUCTION & ASSESSMENT:

a. **Resolution and Proposal for Junior Achievement of New Jersey**

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Trenton Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approves the **Resolution and Proposal for Junior Achievement of New Jersey** for the period September 2010 through June 2011, to address the identified need of K-12 Financial Literacy and Economic Education, at **no cost to the Board**. Junior Achievement will provide resources at a given value of approximately \$160,000 to reinforce the principles of business, citizenship, economics, entrepreneurship, ethics/character, financial literacy and career development district-wide. Planned programs include High School Heroes, Job Shadow, Afterschool programs, Traditional programs and Virtual Finance Park.
